line of these two laws is that we will treat your citizens fairly if you treat ours fairly. 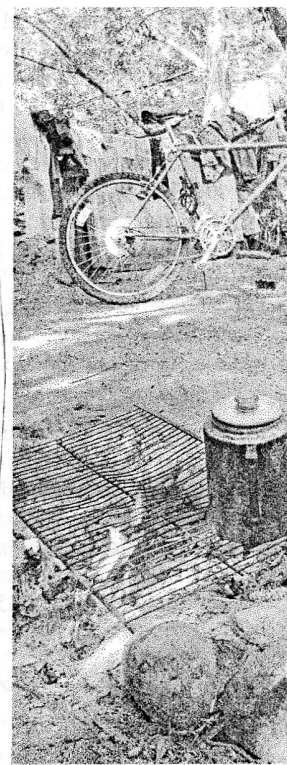

Deep in the thickets of tamarisk and Russian olive that line the banks of the Colorado and Gunnison rivers, dozens of Grand Junction's homeless and dispossessed people have setup numerous camps.

"He who works the land, owns the land," said Jerry as he showed me his hidden garden. Peppers, corn, squash, potatoes, and onion grew out of the sandy soil on the banks of the Colorado River. Jerry, who has been living 'on the river' for almost two years, hauls all the water for his garden by hand from the Colorado River. "We're not lazy. We're not bums. We don't mind hard work," Jerry said.

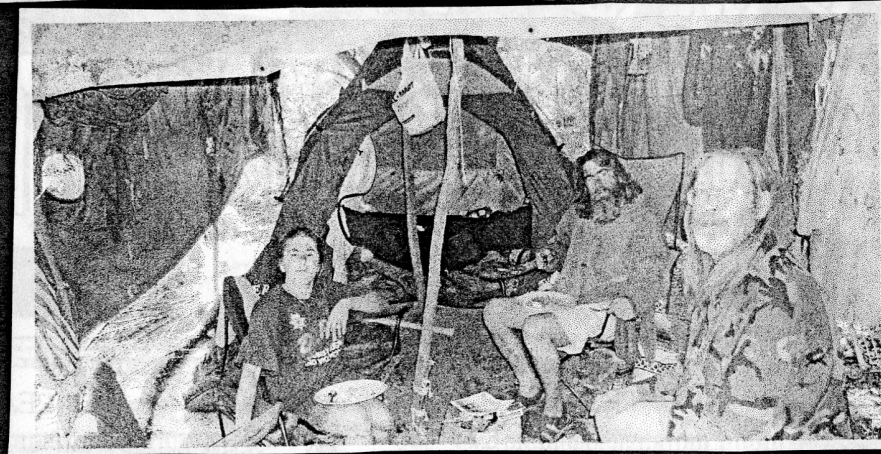
Bev Lampley, with Catholic Outreach, said that they have seen a steady increase in the homeless population in the Grand Valley. Catholic Outreach's soup kitchen, which serves lunch for about 200 people, five days a week, has seen more and more families with kids. Bev said that school District 51 estimates that it serves 450-500 homeless students. "We're seeing more and more desperation," Lampley said. In addition to homeless kids and families, there are as many as 400 single homeless people living mostly in the city, according to Lampley. The problem is that there are a total of only 77 beds in the summer, and 136 beds in the winter in area homeless shelters. "We're turning people away daily."

Homeless camps along the river basins in the Grand Junction area, take many forms. From a sleeping bag and poncho, to corrugated tin shacks, and everything in between. Some are littered with trash, others are exceptionally well kept.

Over the years, the City of Grand Junction has conducted mass-evictions of homeless camps along the river. Until recently, this included throwing away all the squatters' personal property.

Some camps are home to those who live there. "This isn't camp. This is home," Puma corrected me soon after I arrived at his camp. Puma has been living in the river basin in Grand Junction for 7 years. His girlfriend, Debbie, has been on the river for almost 5 years.

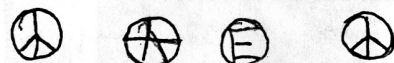
"This is our life. It's simple and quiet," Debbie said, as we spent the morning smoking cigarettes and drinking beer.

Spring run-off is a tense time for those living on a number of islands in the middle of the Colorado River. The crossings become dangerous. "Last winter, I saw Steve White go down the river. They never found him," Puma said. According to Puma, Steve White was not the first nor will he be the last person

to die living on the river. According to Lampley, there were about 20 known local homeless deaths in 2005. The night after The Red Pill camped on the river, Puma had his jaw broken by a stranger with an axe handle.

Debbie and Puma's camp consisted of an A-frame made of tamarisk covered with an old wall-tent canvass. A tent was set up underneath the back portion of the the A-frame. Three chairs were set up in the vestibule. They had a kitchen table with utensils and flatware, in front of a pantry made out of two metal poles and six-plastic milk crates. A small fire ring was used for heating, cooking, and burning trash. "We have to haul all of our water in on our backs," Puma said. Logistically, someone from camp has to make a 'town run' everyday.

Currently, the Grand Valley Coalition for the Homeless is looking for volunteers to help in a 'Point-in-Time' survey on the evening of the 28th and 29th of August to canvass the town to try to get a better estimate of Grand Junction's homeless population. Training will be held on August 24th & 25th at 1pm. For more info call Bev Lampley at 241-3658

the speakers, but added, "that's their right."

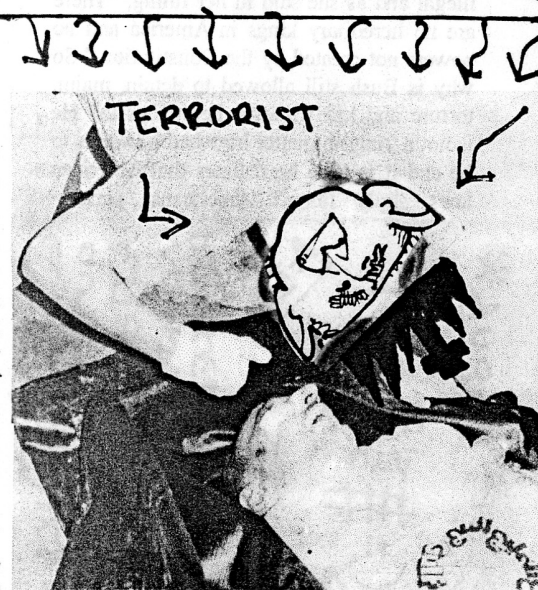
The WCJFI's protest was able to hijack much of media attention at Tancredo's endorsement rally.

After the rally, Scott Tipton was over heard saying, "You know your doing something right if you have protesters."

Reports have since surfaced that the podium used for the rally was actually property of Mesa State College. Which seems to violate Title 1 Article 45 Section 117 of the Colorado Revised Statutes. Hallen, in reference to the use of Mesa State's podium said, "I apologize formally for this misunderstanding," and that "sometimes stuff like this happens."

be in violation of the 1996 War Crimes Act and the Constitution. Instead of obeying the law, the Bush regime signed into law a bill in December of 2005 that would strip the courts of their ability to rule on his actions (Detainee Treatment Act of 2005). So while an American soldier could be tried for abusing and torturing prisoners, the man who ordered him to do so, would be exempt from all prosecution and accountability. Where is the equal accountability underneath the law now, how can Bush say he is taking democracy abroad if he is destroying it in his home country?

His assault on equal representation for all underneath the Constitution has not stopped there. Now he is attempting to overturn the War Crimes Act which was created, along with the Geneva Convention, to protect Americans that may have been taken prisoner while abroad. The bottom

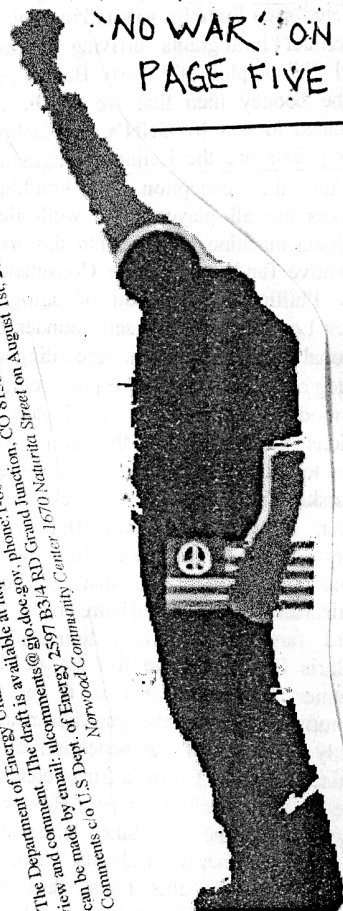

## PROTESTERS STEAL TANCREDO'S THUNDER

On Thursday, August 10th, Western Colorado Justice for Immigrants activists showed up to protest U.S. Congressman Tom Tancredo's (R) endorsement rally for local Republican Candidate for U.S. Congress, Scott Tipton. Carrying large yellow banners calling for 'justice for immigrants,' the activists took up position on the steps of the old county court house behind the speaker's podium.

Tancredo is known for his harsh stance on the immigration issue. He advocates

building a wall for the entire length of the border. "It has worked in that area," Tancredo said in reference to the border fence in the San Diego area. Tancredo has become one of the loudest and angriest voices in the House on the immigration debate. He was quoted by MSNBC as saying immigrants are "a scourge that threatens the very future of our nation."

In Grand Junction, Tancredo attacked Tipton's opponent, John Salazar, for supporting amnesty for the 11-20 million economic refugees living in this country. "We need help on the issue of immigration, and Salazar is not with us," Tancredo said, endorsing Tipton as the tough on immigration candidate.

About half of the 30 people in attendance were protesters, who lightly heckled the speakers, calling out "Justice for Immigrants" and other slogans.

Tom Acker, a Spanish professor at Mesa State College, said that he was at the rally to "make sure that our perspective is represented as well as his." According to Acker, Justice for Immigrants supports comprehensive

human immigration reform, which includes a path to citizenship, the Dream Act (which allows children of immigrants with irregular paperwork to attend colleges), and regulation that keeps families together.

Dirk Hallen, Scott Tipton's campaign manager said, the protesters showed "a lack of respect" for holding their banners behind

## THE MAINSTREAMING OF NATIVIST RACISM

Vanderbilt University political science professor Carol Swain says: "Not thinking deeply about our immigration policies we have created the conditions for long-term racial unrest" (The Nation 8/28-9/4/06).

What do Lou Dobbs, Chris Simcox, Phil Valentine, Lou Sheldon and Benjamin Franklin all have in common?

They have all called the immigrants arriving on American soil "dangerous" "with alien customs" "unwilling to assimilate." Ben Franklin was talking about the German immigrants arriving in his beloved Philadelphia of Liberty Bell fame. Now the boogey men that we are being manipulated to fear by CNN's Lou Dobbs and his guests are the Latino immigrants.

With the exception of Franklin, the others are all players in a well-oiled propaganda machine plugged into the neo-conservative fundraiser Diener Consultants run by Phillip Sheldon, son of anti-gay crusader Lou Sheldon, himself founder of Traditional Values Coalition. According to watchdog blogger David Neiwert of Orcinus, "the modus operandi with Sheldon's operations is consistently the same. He panders to far-right interests, obtains their membership lists, and then funnels them to other, mostly mainstream, right-wing interests. His clients include the Republican National Committee. So, that is how extremist fear mongering and hatred becomes standard fare for American households.

Chris Simcox is the founder of the Minutemen movement. He is a former actor, turned make-believe gun-fighter and currently is being courted by neoconservative fundraisers. Initially he was a fringe element on the American political scene. However, that was before he was taken under the wing of the Diener Consultants. Like a dangerous narcotic, this racist discourse was injected into the American political

scene: On April 19, 2006, Simcox appeared on Fox's "news" program Hannity & Colmes where he ordered the president: "Declare a state of emergency and deploy the National Guard and military reserves, or by Memorial Day weekend, we're going to break ground and we're going to start helping landowners to build a double-layer security fence along their properties" ("Locked and Loaded" The Nation 8/28-9/4/06). On May 15th, Bush ordered 6,000 National Guard troops to the border. Coincidence?

Lou Dobbs used to be just another paunchy white talking head. Now he is the mouth piece and stage for white supremacist tirades: "Dobbs' show has become the pipeline for nativists and nationalists to move their views from the margins into the mainstream" (Dave Burghart director of the Center for New Community). "Many of the most hard-core anti-immigrant activists have appeared on his program--people like Joe McCutchen, one-time member of the Council of Conservative Citizens (CCC), the largest white nationalist organization in the country. He appears on the program without any attempt by Dobbs to expose his involvement with those organizations" (The Nation 8/28-9/4/06). Dobbs has frequent guests with racist pedigrees, which he neglects to identify as such. This omission is dangerous, because the unwitting viewer assumes that he is watching news, when in fact he is being exposed to dangerous white-supremacist brainwashing.

The real culprit in all this, of course is not Lou Dobbs, rather the CNN Corporation, which is realizing huge profits by airing this divisive, hateful programming. Why is this dangerous? Because of this type of programming, "hate groups think they've found an issue with racial overtones and a real resonance with the American public, and they are exploiting it as effectively as they can" Southern Poverty Law Center Report "Immigration Fervor fuels racist extremism" (Vol. 36, Num. 2, June 2006). According to the director of the Southern Poverty Law Center's Intelligence Project, "there is a 33%
