IRAQ VETERANS WINTER SOLDIER: IT'S OUR TURN TO TELL OUR STORIES

In 1971, a courageous group of veterans exposed the criminal nature of the Vietnam War in a public investigation called Winter Soldier. The name was inspired by the patriot Thomas Paine, who wrote: "These are the times that try men's souls. The summer soldier and sunshine patriot will, in this crisis, shrink from the service of his country; but he that stands it now, deserves the love and thanks of man and woman."

For the first time since the U.S. invasion, hundreds of veterans will be gathering in Washington to speak out and tell their stories. Local (Colorado) veterans will be joining the effort by showing a live feed of the Winter Soldier event and joining a nationwide network of veterans and active duty service members committed to speaking out about a reality that, until now, has remained hidden.

From March 13-16 at the National Labor College just outside of Washington

D.C., veterans from across the country will be standing up to share their experiences at Winter Soldier: Iraq and Afghanistan. Their stories will show the human consequences of failed policy.

"We've heard from the politicians, we've heard from the generals, we've heard from the media—now it's our turn," said Kelly Dougherty, executive director of IVAW and a former sergeant in the Colorado Army National Guard, who served in Iraq as a military police officer. "It's not going to be easy to hear what we have to say. It's not going to be easy for us to tell it. But we believe that the only way this war is going to end is if the American people truly understand what we have done in their name."

9/11 TRUTH AT THE MESA COUNTY DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION

Around 500 delegates to the Mesa County Democratic Convention were exposed to 9/11 Truth Saturday, March 1, as local volunteers handed out DVDs and information cards to people filing into Central High School Auditorium. The purpose of this outreach was informing delegates about a proposed resolution to the County Democrats' platform calling for a new, independent 9/11 investigation.

At the end of the day's business, a presentation to about 60-70 delegates who stayed to listen to resolutions went over some facts about the discrepancies and unanswered questions surrounding the collapse of WTC Building 7 and the apparent gross security failure at the Pentagon on September 11, 2001. A delegate who supported the controversial resolution said he didn't think it had a chance of passing, but it did with a 39-19 vote, earning the necessary 2/3 of votes cast. It was the only successful resolution of three that were proposed. With this move, the Mesa County Democratic Party joined other Democratic gatherings, especially in the Denver area, which have called for new 9/11 investigations during the 2008 platform process, hopefully in sufficient

numbers to force the issue to be considered at the state and national levels of the party.

This was a great victory for 9/11 Truth awareness, and it showed the good that can come from getting involved in the political process and promoting issues that aren't receiving attention from the mainstream. •

CLOTH DIAPERS

People just don't realize how easy cloth diapers really are. They save so much money and are truly better for your baby, and the environment.

I started my son in plastic diapers until his umbilical cord fell off. I was so happy it fell off the day it did because he was starting to get his first (and last) diaper rash. I bathed him then let him lay around most of the day with no diaper, to air out. I didn't want to use diaper rash cream, and I didn't have to. It was cleared up by that evening and I started him in cloth.

My husband was totally against cloth diapers (at first), but after I did the math and showed him that it was going to cost up to \$3000 to diaper one child until he is two, he decided to give it a try. He has even told me how easy it is; when his first thoughts were of how much harder it was going to be.

My husband was also worried about was how we would change his diaper when we weren't at the house, where we had a basket to throw the dirties until evening when I threw them in the washer to soak overnight. So, I would bring a zip lock bag (preferably freezer gallon size) in the diaper bag to store the dirties until I got home. I have since bought a little bag that does the same thing, it's just cuter. Wow.

We both like using cloth diapers because it is sooooo much less wasteful (who wants to fill up a whole land fill with dirty diapers?), it saves a ton of money, our son does not get diaper rashes, and research shows that cloth diapered babies are easier to potty train (yeah!).

Initially we invested \$185 in 75 cloth diapers, seven outside wraps (made of a

plastic-like material), and seven snappies (a safe alternative to the diaper pin). We started him in the second size up (13" x 13.5") to save money - they grow so fast and a little big is better than a little too small. Of course, I did have to buy the next size up (16" x 16"), along with four outer wraps and snappies. I got all this from www.greenmountaindiapers.com. I use the brand Bummis Super Whisper Wraps, and the cloth insides are called Cloth-eez Prefolds.

Here are the care steps that I follow, but if you order from this website, they give you an awesome handout with lots of folding suggestions and tons of other washing and care instructions:


1. Get a basket (or whatever). No lid needed if you are breast feeding; breast-fed babies' diapers don't smell
2. Fill the washer up with water and add half the amount of dye and perfume-free soap needed for a normal load.
3. Put all the diapers and wraps in together and let them soak overnight.



Then start the washer in the morning.

4. Line dry your diapers; they will last longer and the sun naturally bleaches them (less chemicals). Dryers are also fine.
5. If your baby is prone to diaper rashes, add half a cup of vinegar to the rinse cycle.
6. NEVER USE ANY FABRIC SOFTENER. It makes the diapers less absorbent.
7. Try not to use diaper creams, oils, or other products on your baby's bum; it makes the diapers less absorbent.

The Fun Liberation Front is nothing. We are merely people who wish to bring the fun of life back into the public eye.





IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF OUR ANCESTORS

In February 11, 2008, the Longest Walk 2 stepped off from Alcatraz. They will be walking over 4,000 miles to Washington D.C. to commemorate the 30th anniversary of the Longest Walk of 1978. The Indian spiritual walk is split up into a northern route and a southern route. The northern route will be making its way into Colorado on Saturday, March 14th, and will be in Grand Junction on March 15th, via Highway 50.

From their website: "The Longest Walk is an Indian spiritual walk, a historical walk; and it is a walk for educational awareness to the American and the world communities about the concerns of American Indian people. This route will carry the message of Renewing the Spirit by Walking in the Footsteps of our Ancestors. This walk is to commemorate the Longest Walk in 1978-those who walked then and those who walk now. We are walking to bring awareness of the struggle to protect sacred sites."

The Red Pill has had the pleasure of contacting Mano Cockrum, the Colorado Organizer for the northern route, and was able to ask a few questions.

The Red Pill: Why do you think it's important to work with and support organizations such as those putting on the longest walk?

Mano Cockrum: It is more important than ever to the health & sustainability of our communities and in turn the world community to take part in undertakings like the Longest Walk by supporting or participating. When we reach out to each other and create these networks of support on the spiritual message and indigenous issues the walk highlights, we are effectively acting out the vision the walk carries with it: that All Life is Sacred and to Protect Mother Earth. We show that we can cooperate in reaching these goals in concrete ways such as creating awareness, protecting sacred sites and cleaning up our Mother and leaving prayers instead where the walkers tread.

TRP: What does this kind of organizing mean to you?

MC: This kind of organizing is for me, necessary to staying connected with a strong indigenous and social justice network in which efforts of partnerships can bring

us all closer to our similar goals of social change and justice on the community level, creating the kind of future we wish to pass on to emerging generations. Organizing always has its motives and drives; in this case the purpose is not merely to survive, but to do it with dignity and respect for each other and the world we are fortunate to live in.

TRP: Do you have any advice for those interested in getting involved but are unsure how?

MC: Just email your interest to Longestwalk1978@gmail.com to plug in, and get familiar with what's happening at www.longestwalk.org. Let us know how you might be able to help-there are so many ways from joining the walkers, hosting them, collecting donations of goods or gas cards, holding awareness and fundraiser events in your community, spreading the word, or even buying a T-shirt online!

TRP: Do you have anything else you would like to add?

MC: I truly do see this effort as not only a preservation and survival issue for Native Americans, but truly for all people sharing this earth. The message is clear: what do we want our grandchildren to inherit, and how can we make that happen?

The Longest Walk is open to participants of all walks of life. There are many ways to get involved, from walking with them, to donations of money or supplies.

On Saturday, March 15, 2008, the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of the Grand Valley will be hosting a potluck dinner for the walkers beginning at 5:30pm. Following the potluck will be a speaking event by numerous members of various Native American nations, including Western Shoshone, Paiute, California Nations, Osage, and Choctaw, among others. There will also be singing by the Miwok singers and other groups.

Everyone is encouraged to attend, bring a dish and stay to hear stories, the walkers' experiences and why they think this walk is important.


A WORM'S EYE PERSPECTIVE
