The Red Pill vs. The Mainstream

The driving force behind this pamphlet is to inform, to give the uninformed a quick overview of all of the news that the mainstream didn't have time to run. You know the real stories, the one's that get buried, and now that this nation's media has been consolidated down to six corporations, stories that get buried stay buried. Noam Chomsky said that the key to seeing through mass media racket is to ask: What are they selling? What does the Daily Sentinel sell? (Hint: its not newspapers.) They're selling you, selling readers to the advertisers.

Advertisers are censors. Money and business interest kill stories and investigations. For example, every year thousands of Americans die due to corporate negligence with little media fanfare, this is due in part to the viewers own blood lust, which favors war, crime, and natural disasters. The other factor in the mass media black out on corporate polluting, and negligence resulting in death, is that the corporate behemoths hold the purse strings. Honestly, what newspapers could afford to lose the Nike or the Wal-Mart account? None of them, so leverage is applied, stories die, and we lose. In the last couple of decades we have gone from tens of thousands of locally owned newspapers, radio, and broadcast media outlets to today where six companies control 95% of this nation's media. This nation holds its freedom of press dear. A well-informed populace is essential to a functioning democracy. How well informed are we? How well is our democracy working? Media consolidation has an adverse effect on how well informed we are. The big six limit choice; there is hardly any dissent in the mainstream media.

We have about fifteen hundred daily newspapers and not one of them have come out against Gulf War I, the Kosovo War, The Afghan War, or the Gulf War II, nor has a single daily in America come out against the ensuing occupations. This seems impossible to me, odds would have at least one newspaper coming out against these unnecessary wars. There is the old journalism parable about the visiting Soviet journalist during the 80's. The journalist reads the papers, watches the news, and then after a week of observing our media he asks: "How do you get all the media to say the same thing, in Russia we have to imprison people, torture people, and use state run media to achieve the same results?" We do, technically, have a freedom of press from government censorship, but corporate censorship, and advertiser censorship reign supreme. Editors, unwilling to piss off a major advertiser, kill articles; the journalist in the field kills articles because they know the rules. The customer is always right, and again who is the consumer in the media racket—Advertisers.

Mohamed Atta's Luggage?

On the morning of September Eleventh, Mohamed Atta was to fly from Portland Maine to Boston, and from Boston to L.A. In Portland he checked two bags through all the way to L.A. His bags contained "a hand held electronic flight computer; a simulator procedures manual for Boeing 757 and 767 aircrafts; two video tapes relating to 'air tours' of the Boeing 757 747 aircrafts; a slide-rule flight calculator; and a copy of the Quran" "a Saudi passport, an international driver's license, a religious cassette tape," "airline uniforms" Atta's will, and a strange note. Wasn't his luggage destroyed when it slammed into the north tower? No, it missed the connection and was waiting for investigators in Boston's Logan International Airport. The mainstream media at the time never questioned the "lucky" circumstances in which the bags were found. Why would he bring the bags onto a suicide mission? Maybe he checked the bags as to avoid suspicion, but then why would his will be in the bags? Why would he bring such hard to find air terror aids, only to destroy them, instead of giving them to future terrorists? Under the heading of "last night" presumably September 10th the writer of the note tells his followers to "remind yourself that in the night you will face many challenges. But you have to face them and understand it 100 percent. Obey God

his messenger, and don't fight among yourself [sic] where [sic] you become weak... Everybody hates death, fears death." The writer of this note was not a Muslim. First off no Muslim would begin a prayer/note with "...In the name of God, of myself, and of my family." A Muslim would never include his family in such a prayer, and whenever a Muslim mentions God he would mention the Prophet Mohamed immediately afterwards. No true believer would "hate death" nor "fear death;" a true believer would believe that his death would be a beginning of a new life in paradise. Even weirder is that the writer of the note encourages his fellow terrorist to recite the Morning Prayer, then the writer quotes from the Morning Prayer, this is as ridiculous as a Christian being reminded how to say the Lord's Prayer.

I personally believe that Atta's luggage is just too convenient for the government, and too illogical from a common sense perspective. The contents of the bags backed up the government's official version of the truth perfectly; the note mentions the knives, which the official story has said time and again were the only weapons used, despite evidence to the contrary. The contents of the bags are illogical if you take into consideration that Atta knew they were going to be destroyed; his will, valuable computers and other aids in air terror that could be used by future terrorist, it doesn't add up. I think the government packed the bag. It would explain its miraculous recovery at the airport, it would explain the shoddy Islamic note, and it would explain the "evidence" in Atta's bag that backed up many of the otherwise un-provable assertions of the official story.

The Plastic War

Plastic being synonymous with fake, like plastic tits, and plastic X-mass trees, I think plastic is the perfect fit for this fraudulent war in Iraq. The plastic war began with plastic intelligence, and outright lies by top officials. Bush's claim that Saddam was seeking uranium from Nigeria turned out to be fake, and on top of that it appears that the administration knew that the

In addition to controlling the flow of information via "In Bed" journalist, the Bush administration prohibited photographs of the body bags and flag covered coffins that arrive back in the states daily. The war on CNN, and the war on Fox news is not the war on the ground.

The pentagon has taken the propaganda war further than just limiting the supply of information. The Pentagon actively created its own news. Take for example POW Jessica Lynch's "daring nighttime rescue." The Pentagon grew the myth. They said that she suffered gun shot wounds, stab wounds, and even that she fought them off with her bare hands, all of which turns out to be false, all her injuries were sustained when her vehicle over turned.
